From the Principal's Desk

Welcome back to the 2018 Academic Year! I would like to extend a special welcome to those students and their parents who are new to the school.

2018 CLASS FORMATIONS

Apart from the e3 and CAPA classes (7L and A respectively), all other Year 7 classes are mixed ability (7 M, B, T, O and N). In Year 8, there are two equal academic classes (8L and 8A) based on yearly report ranks when compared to the whole cohort. All other classes are mixed ability (8 M, B, T, O and N). In years 9 and 10, there is one extension class (9/10 L), one academic class (9/10 A) and all other classes are mixed ability. Students will be within the top thirty positions for extension class placement, and outside the top thirty positions but within the top sixty places for academic class placement based on their assessment rank in 2017. In mathematics, students will be placed in three learning stages: 5.3, 5.2 and 5.1.

Placement in the extension and academic classes are reviewed on a semester basis on the following considerations:

- Academic performance
- Commitment to learning
- Student behaviour



SPORTS FOR TERM 1

Sport choices for Term 1, 2018 will be occurring on Wednesday 31st January, Week 1 this term. All students currently in years 8, 9 and 10 need to make a choice. Students will be given all information on how to select a sport. Sports that require a note need to be returned to the student office before Wednesday 7th February (Note: If the students does not have a note for sports that require one, they cannot go to that sport).
