NAPLAN TESTS : YEAR 7 & 9

Students in Years 7 and 9 participate in the annual NAPLAN tests in reading, writing, language conventions (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracy. Tests will take place from 15th to 17th of May. The tests provide parents and schools with an understanding of how individual students are performing at the time of the tests. NAPLAN tests are just one aspect of a school's assessment and reporting process; they do not replace ongoing assessments made by teachers about student performance.

NAPLAN tests also provide schools, education authorities and governments with information about how education programs are working and whether young Australians are meeting important educational outcomes in literacy and numeracy.

SOUL CAFÉ – FOOD DONATIONS WANTED

Soul Café was established in August 2003 to serve hot meals free of charge to the highly disadvantaged of the Newcastle region. Today Soul Cafe provides hundreds of meals each week. Many of Soul Cafe's guests are dealing with issues of homelessness, drug or alcohol addiction, crime or violence, poverty, separation, mental health or illness concerns and accommodation needs. The ultimate mission of Soul Cafe is to see vulnerable cafe guests reconnected with the community and placed on a path towards increased safety, health and purpose.

Harriet Murphy is leading the SRC in raising donations of food for Soul Cafe for the last two weeks of term. Below is a list of food donations that Soul Café use – sugar, tea, coffee, milo, baked beans (ring pull can), spaghetti (ring pull can), tinned tomatoes, tinned fruit, condensed milk, custard powder, powdered milk, pasta, tins of soup – chunky style (pull ring cans), coco powder. Food donations can be left in the Library.



School staff voluntarily provide tuition support for students each week. Students can use this opportunity to gain assistance with classwork, assignments, homework and assessment. This is available in the Library from 3.05 pm to 4 pm every Thursday afternoon.
